GREEN LIGHT: The Administration can implement this Nominated Idea under its current work plan. Item should be sent to Council to add to Department
work plan. (1) How will the Idea be approached? (2) If adopted, what is its impact and/or tradeoff to the City Roadmap or to a Department work plan,

YELLOW LIGHT: The Administration recommends Council send this Nominated Idea to the Priority Setting Process due to (describe cost implications, workload
impacts, or other factors).
The City Council approved amendments to the San José Municipal Code Business Licenses and Regulations (Title 6, Chapter 6.88, Medical and Non-Medical Cannabis), the
Zoning Ordinance (Title 20), and directed updates to the City Manager Regulations for Cannabis Businesses on February 15, 2022. Staff issued an Info Memo on September 23,
providing a six-month status update on implementation.
Additional amendments to the Cannabis business ordinance is not currently in PBCE and Police work plans but would require staff resources. The ordinance changes detailed in
the memo to the Rules Committee will require referrals to the Airport Land Use Commission and Planning Commission. While staff anticipates limited environmental review
(likely a staff-prepared Addendum to the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration) public outreach will also be required, adding to the timeline. Given other current priority
work plan items for Citywide Planning Division in PBCE, it is recommended that the cannabis ordinance amendments go to the Council's Roadmap process for prioritization.
