Background

April 11, 2022: City Council Special Meeting General Charter Review Commission Recommendations

- Recommendation. To provide a stipend to all members of boards and commissions
- Result. Create a Manager's Budget Addendum on costs and staff impacts

May 25, 2022: Manager's Budget Addendum #20

Analysis. To consider the cost and staffing impacts of implementing recommendation

June 14, 2022: City Council Approval of Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Operating Budget

• **Result.** Manager's Budget Addendum #20 was **not** included in the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Operating Budget approved by City Council (Budget adopted on June 21, 2022)

August 30, 2022: City Council Discussion on Stipends – San José for All

 Result. Administration committed to return to City Council with analysis and recommendation by which stipends could be provided to all boards and commissions to reduce barriers

- Desired outcome: More perspectives in shaping the City's policies, programs, and budgets









Recommendation

Provide Financial Need-Based Stipends of \$200 per month to each member of a board or commission established under Chapter 2.08 of the Municipal Code or the City Charter:

- Who is not currently receiving a stipend
- If they have attended a monthly meeting
- Members to receive stipend if monthly meeting is canceled
- Who is a member of a low-income household
 - Low-income household defined for Santa Clara County
 - Up to \$92,250 for one-person household
 - Up to \$105,400 for two-person household
 - Up to \$118,600 for three-person household
 - Up to \$131,740 for four-person household

□ Direct the City Clerk's Office to develop financial need-based stipend application form; post information on Boards and Commissions website

☐ Direct the City Manager's Office to work with departments who staff boards and commissions, ensuring that stipend budgeting and administration are coordinated
