Mayor Liccardo, Vice Mayor Jones, and Councilmembers Jimenez, Esparza, Cohen, Davis, Foley, Peralez, Carrasco, Mahan, and Arenas,

Re: Special Meeting on Filling Vacancies in Council Districts 8 and 10

As leaders of community, labor and multiracial grassroots organizations that represent working families and tenants, we're urging you to support a thoughtful, transparent and community-centered appointment process to fill the vacancies in Districts 8 and 10 to ensure that residents in these districts have continuity of representation, and that the new council can get to work on pressing priorities such as homelessness, public safety, and filling almost 1000 vacancies towards providing critical community services..

We urge you to approve recommendations laid out in the memo put forth by Councilmembers Cohen and Jimenez, and allow Council to exercise their right as written in the city charter to appoint new councilmembers to finish out the districts' respective terms. As pointed out in the memo from the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters: **a special election could cost \$7-11 million dollars, have extremely low, consequently unrepresentative, voter turnout and will not yield a councilmember until August of next year, just a few months before the 2024 election cycle begins.**

As public servants, non profit employees, and labor leaders, we are united in the shared goal of ensuring that our institutions build community and serve our most vulnerable residents. We know that **tax dollars should be invested back into communities** to keep parks clean, expand library and community center hours, and ensure public safety is a priority — especially in the face of a possible recession and the introduction of austerity budgeting. Resources must be invested into

employees and programs, not expensive low turnout special elections that will have low voter participation and diminish the voices of most residents.

A thoughtful and community centered appointment process would seat council members on a much shorter timeline, involve the community in a more meaningful way, and avoid wasting millions of dollars from the city budget that can instead be used to focus on issues that our organizations have been advocating for, and that your offices have identified as urgent priorities: Real solutions to homelessness, housing access, safer neighborhoods, essential services and critical infrastructure for the future.

We appreciate your thoughtful consideration of this important decision to ensure that those who live, work and play in Districts 8 and 10 have a high quality representative on the Council in the near-term. We encourage you to scrap an expensive and time consuming special election in favor of a thoughtful, community centered appointment process.



Honorable Mayor and City Council members,

I urge you to adopt the following steps for filling the District 8 and 10 council seat vacancies:

- Hold special elections to select permanent replacements
- Appoint temporary replacements to serve from January 1st until permanent replacements are selected by district voters
- Work with the Registrar of Voters to expedite the special election process as much as possible without significantly increasing the cost
- Consider ways of reducing the cost of the special elections, for example by holding them as 100% mail-in/drop-off, potentially with a limited number of voting centers to accommodate voters with special needs or a strong desire to vote in person
- Establish minimum criteria for selection of temporary appointees (see draft list below)

We often heard that democracy was on the ballot in the November election. More fundamentally, voter trust was on the ballot. The new council will face major challenges and need the trust and support of their constituents. ***Please don't set the new council up for failure by stripping them of the public trust.***

It's ironic and quite telling the same forces who decried ***voter suppression*** during the redistricting process now want you to eliminate the ability of two entire districts to select their own representatives. Clearly they are attempting to game the system for their benefit, which is completely unacceptable. If they are truly concerned about voter turnout, they need to do the hard work of getting out the vote, just like each of you did. ***Please don't stoop to the level of former President Trump in attempts to subvert free and fair elections.***

Before selecting candidates for temporary replacements, I urge you to memorialize selection criteria. I offer this set of draft criteria as a starting point:

- Temporary appointees must agree not to run for the open seat

- Temporary appointees must demonstrate very good knowledge of their respective district's neighborhoods and issues, preferably with experience as a prior elected official, having served on a San Jose or Santa Clara County commission, or having served as an established neighborhood leader
- Temporary appointees should demonstrate very good knowledge of San Jose governance, preferably having worked closely with at least one city council member and their staff for at least two years over the past four years
- If allowable by charter, allow temporary appointees to reside in immediately adjacent districts, especially if they lived in the district immediately prior to 2022 redistricting

I am copying and pasting an article in the San Jose publication dated November 17, 2022, written by Pat Waite (*President of Citizens for Fiscal responsibility*) & Rich Crowley (*Vice President of CFR*) titled " 'Let Us Vote'; Voters, Not Council, Should Fill Vacancies"

We wholeheartedly agree with Mr. Waite and Mr. Crowley. Until redistricting, we were in D10. We can't imagine not being able to vote for a person who would be representing our District.

Article:

San Jose voters have spoken. Our choices have created two upcoming vacancies on our next City Council. Our City Charter provides three options for filling these seats: leaving them vacant pending a special election, appointing interim council persons until a special election fills the seats for the remaining term, and appointing someone to serve out the remaining term. Our current City Council will determine how to fill the vacated seats of Districts 8 and 10 over the next several weeks.

Several arguments are being made in favor of appointing people to fulfill the remaining terms instead of holding a special election. First, special elections are an expensive incremental

cost. Second, it is unfair that residents go unrepresented during the time it takes for a special election. Finally, turnout in special elections is historically low.

Council members have vacated their seats mid-term several times in the past 25 years. In every instance our City Council held special elections. Only once did the council opt to appoint an interim council member pending the results of a special election, and that was a contentious split vote decision. The council has never usurped voters' rights by appointing someone to fulfill a remaining term.

Citizens for Fiscal Responsibility (CFR) feels that precedent should prevail; the council should convene a special election to fill the vacancies. The arguments against doing so don't hold water.

The issue of historically low turnout numbers does not justify appointments to fulfill the remaining terms. CFR believes allowing the 10,000 or so people who will vote in each district's special election to choose their representatives makes more sense than having six councilmembers (a majority of the City Council, possibly none of whom might reside in Districts 8 or 10) appoint the next representatives of the approximately 200,000 total residents of Districts 8 and 10. Voters are entitled to the right to select their representatives.

As for the special election's cost, that is the cost of democracy. Voters' right to elect their representatives is so much more valuable than the cost of a special election. Besides, San Jose has a general fund budget of \$1.7 billion and a total budget approaching \$6 billion. Surely our City Council can reprioritize spending to safeguard our voting rights.

Finally, it is a conceit to believe that residents will suffer while the councilmembers' seats are empty. For starters, many residents can name neither their district number nor their council representative. Secondly, for many of us our council member serves as a conduit to our government services. As long as staff is available to answer our phone calls regarding potholes, garbage service, graffiti, and the like we are generally satisfied. Third, significant issues involving those unrepresented districts can be deferred until such time as newly elected council members are sworn in. Lastly, we residents do have representation in the form of our mayor, who represents all residents of San Jose.

During the just concluded political campaign we often heard the phrase "democracy is on the ballot." The word "democracy" stems from the Greek words "demos" and "kratos," literally meaning "people power." A City Council decision appointing representatives for the remaining terms would be the antithesis of democracy. It would disempower people and contradict the actions taken to increase voter participation.

Now is not the time to reverse course on the hard work done to create a more inclusive, participative, and representative government. It is only fair that the residents of Districts 8 and 10 choose their representatives. CFR believes the City Council should let us vote. We urge you to raise your voices in support of the voting rights of our fellow residents of Districts 8 and 10.
