As you know, The Reach Code was initially passed during the Covid Lockdown Protocol period and many, if not most, did not have meaningful means to understand the implication of the Code.


Having said that, I believe that we (the San Jose development community) will have positive and meaningful thoughts that could make the code more logical, less wasteful and more affordable.
