
















@SJYouth Commission Connecting Youth Communities

In October 2022, City Council directed the Youth Commission and staff to explore expanding the age of Youth Commission appointment eligibility and expanding youth representation on city boards and commissions. The Commission developed recommendations to increase diverse and underrepresented youth civic participation and provide a seat at the table for young people to contribute to decisions made on their behalf.
