San Jose City Charter Section 607

"...The Mayor, on a biennial basis beginning in 1993, shall conduct a review of the City's Code of Ethics including any ordinances relating to ethic standards. The Mayor shall make any recommendation for amendments or changes to the Code of Ethics and its implementing ordinances to the City Council..."

Biennial Ethics Review Current Recommendations

- Mayor Liccardo submitted Review with 2 categories of recommendations (Public Records Act + Brown Act)
- PRA related recommendations aimed to
 - Address rapidly growing volume of PRAs
 - Identify voluntary protocols to focus requests and explore state action
 - Given growing number of digital records, explore updates to City Policy
- Brown Act
 - Clarify City's interpretation of law
