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Redirect CDBG-CV Funding

- Original activity, legal services, could not meet contract spending deadline
- Seventh Substantial Amendment is to FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan per HUD requirement
- ♠ Amendment enables City to redirect and use \$250,000 in existing CDBG CARES Act (CDBG-CV) funds to help vulnerable community members impacted by COVID-19 to avoid evictions
- Emergency rent payments are an eligible activity under public services, and include:
 - Current rent payments
 - Rent payments in arrears



CDBG-CV Funds to Spend in FY 2023-2024

Sacred Heart, Eviction Diversion Agreement

- ▲ Avoids imminent court eviction of tenants due to inability to pay full rent caused by COVID-19 by providing one-time rental assistance
- Tenants with extremely low incomes will be prioritized



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
