A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE APPROVING THE JAPANTOWN BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT BUDGET REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024, AS FILED OR MODIFIED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, AND LEVYING THE JAPANTOWN BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San José established the Jackson-Taylor Business Improvement District pursuant to Ordinance No. 23453 dated May 1, 1990, pursuant to the California Parking and Business Improvement Area Law, California Streets and Highway Code §36500 *et seq*. ("Improvement Law"); and

WHEREAS, in 1993, the Council approved the change of the name of the Business Improvement District to the Japantown Business Improvement District ("BID"); and

WHEREAS, under and pursuant to the Improvement Law, on May 23, 2023 the Council adopted Resolution No. RES2023-159, a resolution declaring the Council's intention to levy the assessments for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 in the BID; and

WHEREAS, said Resolution No. RES2023-159 was duly published, as provided by the Improvement Law; and

WHEREAS, as specified in Resolution No. RES2023-159, a public hearing concerning the levy of assessments for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, was held before the Council on June 6, 2023, at the meeting beginning 11:00 a.m. (to be heard no sooner than 1:30 p.m.) in the Council Chambers of the City of San José, 200 East Santa Clara Street, San José, California, or by teleconference that is open to the public and enables public comment; and

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WHEREAS, written protests against the levy of assessments or against any

specified improvement or activity were filed with the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, oral protests were made at the hearing against the levy of assessments

or against any specified improvement or activity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

SAN JOSE THAT:

1. The Council hereby finds that there were written protests against the levy of

assessments for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and/or against any specified

improvement or activity in the BID, and that there is no majority protest within the

meaning of Section 36525 of Improvement Law.

2. The Budget Report for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 filed with the City Clerk pursuant to

Resolution No. RES2023-159 is hereby approved.

3. The Council hereby finds and determines that the businesses lying within the BID

will be benefited by the expenditure of the funds raised by the assessments or

charges proposed to be levied.

4. The levying of assessments in the BID for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 in accordance

with this Resolution is hereby authorized.
