- Program goals surpass state recycling mandates















Commercial Program

- Serviced 7,600 accounts including 35,000 outreach communications
- "Wet" (organics) = sorted & processed at an anaerobic digestion facility resulting in electricity and compost
- "Dry" (mixed recyclables + non-recyclables) & "Customized" (source separated recyclables) = sorted at a material recovery facility for reuse
- Facility upgrades resulting in increased diversion





IWM Enforcement & Public Litter Cans (PLCs)

- In FY 2021-2022:
 - 664 inspections
 - 144 inspection reports
 - 33 verbal warnings
 - 223 warning notices
 - 10 administrative citations
- IWM manages about 1,330 PLCs citywide
 - Excludes those at VTA stops, parks, community centers, and libraries











FY 2021-22 City Diversion Overview






