I am writing on behalf of Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition, a member-supported nonprofit dedicated to creating a healthy community, environment, and economy through bicycling. SVBC strongly supports the policy proposal, up for discussion under Item 3.6 on tomorrow's City Council agenda, to create Urban Street Park Pilots on San Pedro Street and Post Street.

Similar pilot projects were proposed by participants at <a href="mailto:the-ThinkBike workshop">the ThinkBike workshop</a>, hosted by the Department of Transportation and Dutch Cycling Embassy in 2012. SVBC's support for converting downtown roadways into pedestrian plazas and paseos dates to at least that time. We know that making streets safer for pedestrians makes them safer for all road users, including bicyclists. Urban pedestrian zones, like those found in New York City and Santa Monica, also have the benefit of boosting local economies.
