A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY DISASTER MITIGATION GRANTS

WHEREAS, the City of San José ("City") is eligible to file for public assistance claims from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for costs incurred for emergency response and immediate protective measures for Disaster on Record (DR) 4301 (storm of January 3-12, 2017) and DR-4308 (storm of February 1–23, 2017); and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to submit applications for five projects that meet FEMA's reimbursement criteria, including that the project provides direct service to the community, that the project involves an improvement that will reduce impacts of future hazards, that the project can be completed within the grant timeframe, and that funds other than general fund can be tapped for the City contribution requirement; and

WHEREAS, the five projects, the Goldenwheel Storm Pump Station, Flapgate Evaluation and Installation, Confluence Point Embankment Stabilization, Charcot Storm Pump Station, and Century Oaks Park Hill Slide Slope Stabilization, are discussed in detail in the memorandum to the City Council from Raymond Riordan, Director of Office of Emergency Management; and
