RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution authorizing the Director of Public Works to:

- (a) Award a construction contract for the Tamien Park Phase II Project to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 and to approve a five percent contingency in an amount not to exceed \$100,000; and
- (b) Decide any timely bid protest(s), make the City's final determination as to the lowest responsive bidder that is responsible, or reject all bids and re-bid the project.

OUTCOME

Adoption of these recommendations will enable the Director of Public Works to award the project, allowing staff to continue moving forward with design and construction of the Tamien Park Phase II Project in order to meet the grant reimbursement deadline.

BACKGROUND

Tamien Park, a 3.5-acre parcel of land located near the intersection of Lick Avenue and Goodyear Street, was acquired from the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) in 2011. The Park Master Plan and CEQA documents were approved by Council on June 16, 2015.

The Tamien Park Phase I work included demolition, earthwork, export of contaminated soil (includes heavy metals, arsenic, thallium, petroleum hydrocarbons, etc.), grading, site drainage, installation of a parking lot, basketball court, a multi-use court for volleyball/badminton, a table game area, playground area, picnic area, sidewalk, fencing, entry pilasters, signage, sound wall, seat walls, site furnishings, electrical work, irrigation, plantings, and a restroom building. Phase I construction was completed and opened to the public on June 16, 2017.

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Phase II will include a natural turf youth soccer field, an exercise equipment area, a jogging track, an outdoor stage, a small group picnic area and other miscellaneous park facilities.

In November of 2016, the City and the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) agreed to final compensation terms for the southern half of the park site (Phase II Property) under the Purchase and Sale and Escrow Instructions dated June 15, 2011 (PSA) and the First Amendment to the PSA approved in June of 2016, by both parties. The amended agreement with VTA removed the no-development clause in the PSA regarding the Phase II Property.

ANALYSIS

The City was awarded a \$2.2 million grant from the State's 2014 Housing Related Parks Program, which funded the Phase I park construction. Additional funding of \$805,992 was awarded under the same grant program a year later in 2015. The remaining grant funds are to be reimbursed by June 30, 2018, which means that \$805,992 of acceptable construction invoices must be submitted to the State prior to April 30, 2018.

The reason for expediting the construction contract award process is to meet the 2018 grant reimbursement deadline. This memorandum is therefore requesting authorization for the Director of Public Works to award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000, and to resolve any timely bid protest(s), or reject all bids and re-bid the Tamien Phase II Project. The current Engineer's Estimate for Phase II is \$1,650,000.

This memorandum is also requesting authority for a 5 percent construction contingency for unanticipated change orders associated with this project in an amount not to exceed \$100,000. This is a standard contingency amount for park projects.

The 2017-2018 adopted project budget is \$2.5 million in the CIP for the Tamien Phase II Project.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW UP

No follow up action is anticipated at this time.

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COORDINATION

This memorandum has been coordinated with the Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Department and the City Attorney's Office.


