Donated to City October 12, 1958

- The Statue was commissioned in Italy by the Milani Marble Company
 Donated to the City by the San José Civic Club & the Italo-American Societies of San José
- Relocated to its current location after the construction of City Hall



Security Concerns regarding the Christopher Columbus Statue:

- -3/8/2001 the Statue was severely damaged by a sledgehammer
- -9/21/2017 red and black paint was smeared on the Statue
- –10/12/2017 a handful of protesters confronted City Hall visitors and staff in the Tower and disrupted City business
