10.2 18-144 General Plan Text Amendment and Related Changes: Transportation Analysis Policy to Comply with Senate Bill 743.

Recommendation:

The City is updating its transportation analysis policy and related changes to conform with State law (SB 743) and to further the goals and policies of the General Plan by removing the vehicular Level of Service (LOS) metric from transportation analysis under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and replacing it with a Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) metric.

- (a) Adopt a resolution approving the General Plan Text Amendment to reflect the new City Council Transportation Analysis Policy 5-1.
