Domestic Violence Program Annual Data Santa Clara County

In fiscal year 2015-2016, over **6,500** unduplicated domestic violence victims and children were provided with in-person services by our local domestic violence programs:

Hotline Calls	21,746
Number of Emergency Shelter Beds	59
Number of Transitional Housing Beds	9
Bed Nights Provided	23,329
Total Adults/Children Housed in Shelter/Transitional	731

Percentage of Survivors that Moved to Another DV Shelter	28%

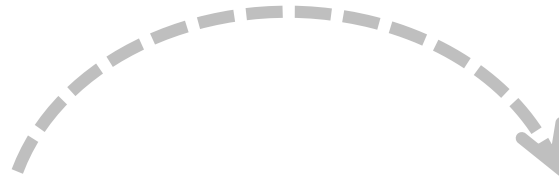
Santa Clara County had **192** domestic violence-related deaths from **2000-2017**

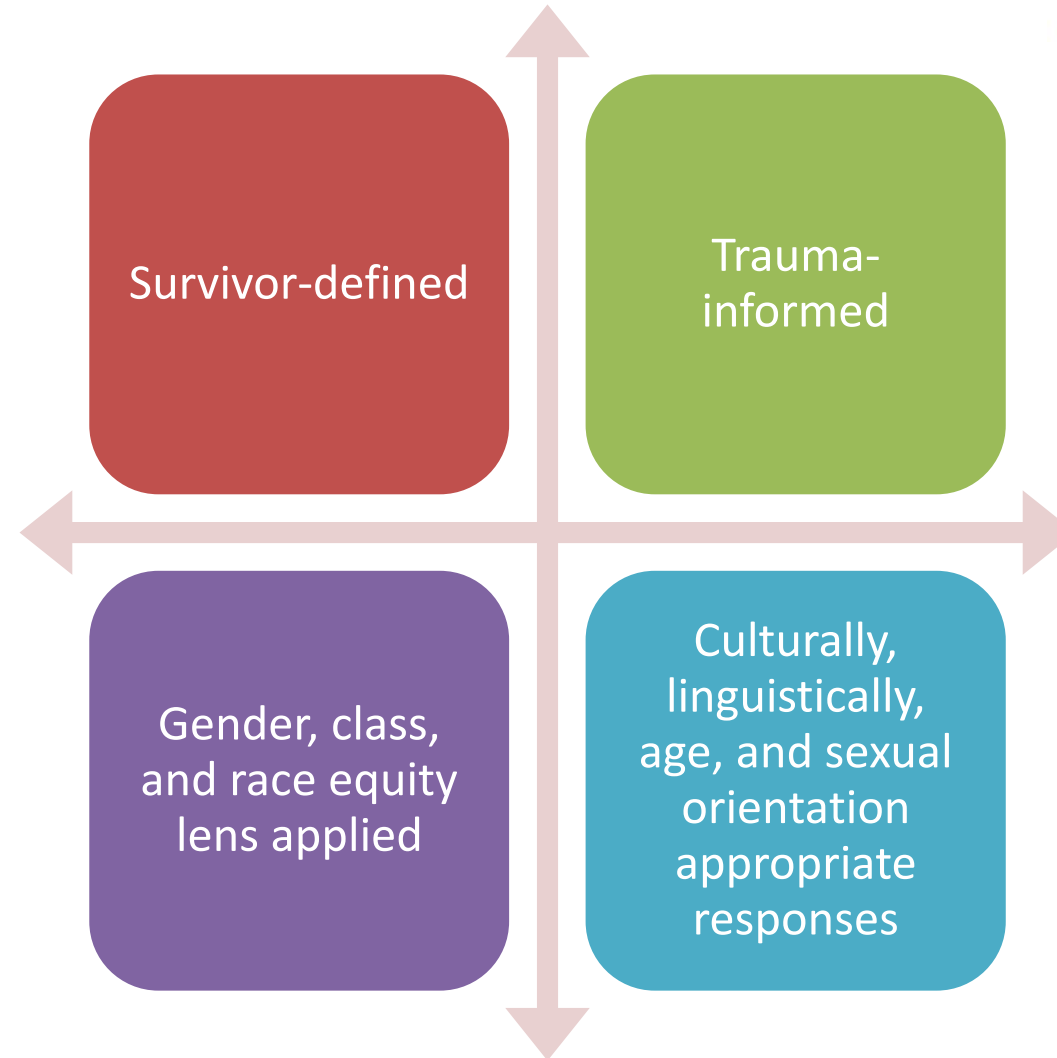
