RECOMMENDATION

PURPOSE OF STUDY SESSION

This study session would consist of a presentation and discussion on the threats, specifically seismic threats, updates on emergency management, and general preparedness training for City of San José Elected and Appointed Officials during a seismic emergency or disaster.

OUTCOME

Expected outcome is increased Council recognition of the seismic emergency management risks, capabilities, gaps, and the Council's role during an emergency or disaster.

BACKGROUND

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is responsible for all emergency management, homeland security, critical infrastructure protection, and continuity programs within the City of San José. The OEM supports the City Manager, who is the City's Director of Emergency Services, in developing, maintaining, and managing the City's emergency management capabilities, including the City's primary, alternate and mobile Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs), emergency communications, and all other aspects of Multi-Agency Coordination Systems (MACS) during an emergency or disaster impacting the City of San José. San José

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OEM is also responsible for supporting the City Council in establishing and operating the Disaster District Offices from which each Councilmember operates during a state of emergency or disaster declaration impacting their Council District.
