RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Approve the State of Latinos: A Cinco de Mayo Call to Action scheduled on May 4, 2018 as a City Council sponsored Special Event and approve the expenditure of funds.
- 2. Approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses, or community groups to support the event.
- 3. Place the item on the March 20, 2018 Council Agenda for action.

BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

The State of Latinos: A Cinco de Mayo Call to Action will be held on May 4, 2018 at Adobe Headquarters and sponsored by Councilmember Raul Peralez. This special event will focus on the progress of the Latinx community and how it is directly tied to the prosperity and economic well being of our state and nation. The program will feature a two panel discussions that will explore the role of – and impact on – California's Latino community in the economy, civic participation, education, and the current political climate. This event is hosted by the League of CA Cities- Latino Caucus, Adobe, San Jose City Councilmember Raul Peralez, Oakland City Councilmember Abel Guillén, Sacramento City Councilmember Eric Z. Guerra, Redwood City Councilmember Alicia Aguirre and Sonoma City Mayor Madolyn Agrimonti. The event is free and open to the public.
