SUBJECT: REPORT ON REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATION FOR COMPREHENSIVE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM CONSULTANT SERVICES

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

- (a) Accept the report on the Request for Qualifications for comprehensive Capital Improvement Program consultant services.
- (b) Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute Agreements with Verde Design (Santa Clara, CA); Callander Associates (San José, CA); Sasaki, Walker, and Associates Group (San José, CA); Moore, Iacofano, Goltsman, Inc. (San José, CA); and LPA, Inc. (San José, CA) for Capital Improvement Program consultant services for a five-year term commencing on or about May 1, 2018 and ending on or about April 30, 2023, with maximum compensation not to exceed \$3,750,000.

OUTCOME

Provide architectural, landscape architectural, environmental, planning, and engineering services to assist the Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services (PRNS) with major Capital Improvement Program projects.

BACKGROUND

PRNS currently manages over 150 active capital projects, from planning through post construction, to implement the approximately \$300 million, five-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The City receives Capital funding Construction and Conveyance taxes, as well as from residential land developers who pay fees in lieu of parkland dedication, to compensate for the increased demand on park amenities due to new development. Currently, there are at least

nine projects that have been funded through these developer fees; however, these projects have not been completed due to insufficient in-house staff to support them. These agreements will provide support to staff during peak work volume periods and on specialty projects.

On October 2, 2017, the City issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ), and after reviewing proposals, selected a consultant pool of five (5) applicants to perform the various CIP master plans and studies over a five-year period, May 1, 2018 through April 30, 2023.

ANALYSIS

Staff released a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Comprehensive CIP Consultant Services through the City's e-procurement system on October 2, 2017, and received the following eight (8) proposals:

- Callander Associates, San José, CA
- Gates & Associates, San Ramon, CA
- LPA, Inc., San José, CA
- Michael Painter Associates (MPA) Design, San Francisco, CA
- Moore, Iacofano, Goltsman (MIG), Inc., San José, CA
- Placeworks, Berkeley, CA
- Sasaki, Walker, and Associates (SWA) Group, San José, CA
- Verde Design, Santa Clara, CA

After determining that each proposal met the minimum qualifications in the RFQ, a five-member evaluation team independently evaluated and scored each proposal against the following criteria and weights: Résumés and Organizational Chart (25%), Planning and Design (40%), Methods Used to Achieve Success (25%), and Local and Small Business Preference (10%).

The City's RFQ process includes a ten-day protest period that commenced when the City issued the Notice of Intended Award on February 20, 2018. No protests were received.

Award Recommendation Summary: Staff recommends awards to the following consultants, which were determined to be the best qualified service providers, per the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFQ:

- Verde Design (Santa Clara, CA)
- Callander Associates (San José, CA)
- Sasaki, Walker, and Associates (SWA) Group (San José, CA)
- Moore, Iacofano, Goltsman (MIG), Inc. (San José, CA)
- LPA, Inc. (San José, CA)

Summary of Agreement: The initial term of each consultant's agreement will be for up to five years. Consultants shall provide comprehensive support for various PRNS projects. Services may include, but are not limited to Architectural, Landscape Architectural, Environmental, Planning, and/or Engineering Consultant services. All work performed under this agreement shall be authorized by a Service Order submitted by the City, providing project parameters and requirements including, but not limited to project descriptions, geographic limits, scopes of service, and schedules of deliverables and performance. In instances when the City requires consultants to work on site in city facilities, the City shall provide consultants a workspace with required equipment (e.g., computer, telephone, internet connection, etc.).

PRNS is requesting maximum compensation up to \$3,750,000 as follows:

The \$3,750,000 maximum compensation requested covers the \$2,525,000 of projects currently funded as listed in the cost implications section of this memorandum. In addition, it covers \$1,225,000 of new projects anticipated to be funded over the next few years. This \$1,225,000 is roughly equivalent to five new master plan projects. Currently, in development of the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget process, new and ongoing projects such as Del Monte Phase III, North San Pedro Street closure, All-Inclusive Playground Concept Development, and the District 4 Dog Park are projects that would likely utilize these consultants' resources.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

This memorandum will not require any staff follow up.

COORDINATION

This memorandum was coordinated with the City Manager's Budget Office and the City Attorney's Office.
