My name is Lee Kopp. I am an Events Captain in the City of San Jose Public Works Department, a member of the Silicon Valley Concierge Association, and I manage arts communications for Symphony Silicon Valley, sjDANCEco, Steinway Society, 3 Below Theaters & Lounge and other local arts organizations.

I was born and raised in San Jose and sat at the knees of City Historian Clyde Arbuckle for many years before his passing and listened to his stories of our city's founding, its background, and certainly of the Light Tower and it's impact on San Jose's reputation throughout the region, the country, and indeed...the world.
