BACKGROUND

LED Streetlights Conversion Update

Staff requests adding the LED Streetlights Conversion Update item to the Smart Cities and Service Improvements Committee June 7, 2018 agenda. In February 2018, through an Information Memo to City Council, the City Manager's Office communicated to the City Council that the City had rejected all proposals submitted in response to the Innovative LED Streetlight Replacement RFP of 2015.
