BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

The SVCTBA Smart City Conference will be held on May 31, 2019 at San José City Hall and cosponsored by Councilmember Johnny Khamis and the Silicon Valley Chinese Technology & Business Association. This special event highlights the latest developments in Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Blockchain, and Smart Manufacturing, and features panel discussions, vendor booths, and product demonstrations. The event is free and open to the public.
