#### SUBJECT: EXTENDING STANDARD HOURS OF CONSTRUCTION

**DATE:** 08/02/18

APPROVED: 8/2/18 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Direct City Attorney to draft ordinance revisions modifying Section 20.100.450 of Chapter 20.100 of Title 20 of the San Jose Municipal Code, governing Construction Work Hours by adding standard hours of construction on Saturdays from 9:00 AM 6:00 PM
- 2) Direct City Manager to effectuate outreach to stakeholders regarding this revision.
- 3) Bring revision back to the full City Council within 90 days, after stakeholder outreach.
- 4) Present for feedback, during stakeholder outreach, some options for revising the weekday hours of construction (Monday through Friday) by:
  - a. Raising the end-time from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM
  - b. Implementing a standard "second shift" that extends to 2:00 AM on weekdays
  - c. Extending work hours, but adding noise and activity-based restrictions.

#### BACKGROUND

The current Municipal Code states that, without planning approval, "no applicant or agent of an applicant shall suffer or allow any construction activity on a site located within 500 feet of a residential unit before 7:00 AM or after 7:00 PM, Monday through Friday, or at any time on weekends."

Comparable cities, such as San Francisco and Oakland, have fewer restrictions on construction hours. The San Francisco Municipal Code allows construction on buildings and structures from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM every day of the week. The Oakland Planning Code permits construction from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM on weekdays; and 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM on weekends and holidays. We also looked at practices of other cities, big and small, throughout the region, and almost all allowed for construction to occur on Saturdays (Exhibit A).

City staff has taken the initiative to adjust administrative processes so that project sponsors include extended work hour requests in their initial permit applications to avoid having to complete the exception process later, and I am grateful for their efforts. Sometimes, however, builders may not be aware of the need for extended hours until well into work on a project. Even the best-planned projects

can run into unexpected circumstances that slow progress and require a need to expand work hours to get work back on schedule. Keeping to the project timeline is very important given that it can be extremely costly to finance a project for any longer than planned.

When project delays happen and extended hours are requested after the initial permits are issued, builders can apply for an exception to work on Saturdays or to work extended hours, but Planning personnel have indicated that it can take two to three months for the public outreach and application review process to be completed. It makes sense to provide standard hours consistent with other cities and to complete the public outreach one time. This should eliminate extra staff work involved in processing exceptions and allow project sponsors more flexibility in arranging their construction schedules.

Information provided by City staff shows that a handful of current projects have applied for and received extended-hours approval, as follows:

- 1. One South Market
  - Saturdays from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM
  - One Saturday from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM for slab cables
  - Seven Saturdays from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM for slab cables
  - Two Saturdays from 1:00 AM to 7:00 PM for concrete pours
  - One Saturday from 4:00 AM to 7:00 AM for concrete pours
- 2. Silvery Towers
  - Saturdays from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM
  - Four Fridays 7:00 PM to Saturdays 11:30 PM for concrete pours
- 3. The Graduate
  - Saturdays from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM
- 4. SJSC/Miro
  - o Six occurrences of 24-hour concrete pours
  - Construction until 1:00 AM (pending)

Other projects have not, as of today, applied for extended hours, but would benefit from an extension of hours, including:

- 1. Centerra
- 2. Modera
- 3. Axis
- 4. Gateway
- 5. The Pierce
- 6. Post/San Pedro
- 7. North San Pedro Tower 3

Builders and tradespeople have expressed their concerns about the difficulty they have in making up valuable time in the construction process when delays occur based upon unforeseen circumstances. The current work hour restrictions prevent them from completing projects as timely as they would wish to, without going through the rather lengthy work hour modification process.

Aside from the benefits for project sponsors, there are several other benefits to adding Saturday hours and exploring other extended hours:

- Shortens of the length of time that neighbors must endure construction-related disruptions.
- Workers financially benefit from overtime pay for extended work hours.
- Given the construction labor shortage in the area, local workers will complete contracts more quickly and be able to move on to other projects faster, reducing our dependence on out-of-area labor.

I ask my colleagues to support this request to speed construction, minimize disruptions, and benefit workers and builders.
