Lessons Learned

- questions (during Q&A) and neighborhood-specific questions which are better stated during the Meeting Time.
- Add the descriptions of "Meeting Time" and "Q&A" to the "Notes" part of the booklet.
- Have a staff list available (not just badges).
- Review responsibilities with each staffer before the caucus starts.
- The question management system (first candidate to answer) needs improvement.
- Delegates aren't "registering." This requirement should be dropped as unnecessary.
- Job description for the Council Staffer: Sit with the Secretary/Recorder during registration to vett the "neighborhood groups" and determine which voting delegate will represent them. Once the questioning starts, sit alongside the Lead Coordinator to determine which questions are of broad interest and should be asked publicly. Neighborhood-specific questions can be answered during the Caucus Meeting Time period.
- The idea of leading/staffing the caucus solely with commissioners from a "partner" district doesn't work. We should revise that concept so that any commissioner can staff any position. It may still make sense for those "assigns" to coordinate the event with the council office so as to provide a single point of contact.
- Many candidates haven't been to a NC meeting or spoken with current commissioners. Consider changing the City Clerk's application process to ensure that people know what they are getting into. This may prevent some turnover when newly-seated commissioners learn what they've gotten into.
- Many candidates do not submit written statements for the booklet, and this seems to be a good indicator that they aren't going to show up. The twoweeks ahead statement deadline isn't very effective, either.

- The ballot count should only be done by the Secretary/Recorder and the Facilitator. Two people commented that it looked like a rigged system because so many people were clustered around the ballots.
- The same two people wanted the vote totals announced.
- There were a lot of questions submitted, but the 30 minute cut-off time was accepted without complaint.
- Notifying a dispersed, loud and engaged crowd that the five minute Meeting
 Time is ending is difficult. Staffers should approach each candidate "huddle"
 to let them know time is expiring and ask if they need an additional five
 minutes. The facilitator makes the call.
