- 50,000+ square feet
- Opened October 2004
- House approximately 18,000 animals per year
- Provide: field services, adoptions, returning lost pets, euthanasia, rescue outreach, medical care, public spay/neuter clinic, licensing, permits
- 70 FTEs
- Service contracts: Milpitas, Cupertino, Saratoga & Los Gatos





Field Services

- 21,508 calls for service FY 17-18
- 100,000 phone calls into Dispatch
- Most common call types: stray dogs and cats, dead animals, humane investigations, barking, nuisances, standards of care, dangerous dogs
- Work with District Attorney animal related cases of cruelty, and



Shelter Services


- Intake & house approximately 18,000 animals per year
 - 6,000 dogs
 - 10,000 cats (5,500 were kittens)
 - 1,100 rabbits, guinea pigs, small mammals, birds, reptiles and small livestock
 - 1,200 wildlife
- Average Daily Population
 - 600 Summer months
 - 200 Winter months





Shelter Services







Live Release Rate (LRR)

- Measures percent of animals saved
- FY17-18 91%
 - 92% cats
 - 94% dogs
- National
 - <50% cats
 - 69% dogs
- How to succeed:
 - rescue groups & transports
 - s/n clinic
 - TNR / SNR
 - grants & donations



Medical, Administration, Fundraising & Marketing/Volunteers

• 2 medical clinics – public / internal

Approximately 10,000 spay/neuter surgeries per year



Licensing: process 65,000 licenses;
 \$1.4m/year

- 39% cost recovery: \$3m revenue,
 \$8m budget
- Gift Trust Guardian Angel program
