Safe Parking Pilot Program: Key Elements

- Target population: Must have at least one minor child
- Families develop individualized case plans
- Families required to work toward obtaining stable housing
- 100% of children enrolled in school
- Serving families from the neighborhood
- Referrals from nearby school



Safe Parking Pilot Program: General Operations

- Seven Trees Community Center/Library
- 7 days per week from 7pm 7am
- **5 17** vehicles
- Staff and/or subcontracted security during program hours
- Basic needs
- Individualized case management
