Mental Health Services & Supportive Housing Considerations



- ☐ Level of Need
 - □ Mental Health: Specialty vs. mild/moderate vs. acute/emergency
 - □ Housing: Permanent supportive, rapid rehousing, one-time/short term
- Eligibility for level of service and for provider
 - □ Funding source & insurance status
 - □ Availability of services
- Location & access points
- Individual choice, legal limitations

Types of "Homeless Outreach"



- Engage, offer services & assess for housing
- Respond to constituent concerns
- Support encampment abatement
- Long-term engagement to build rapport
- Case finding in support of housing programs
