



Commercial Burglaries Day of Week & Time of Day





Burglary Prevention Unit (BPU)

Event #18-121-0512: BPU developed information that a business, Vien Dong Cargo, was buying stolen merchandise from retailers in San Jose and surrounding areas.

- Stolen merchandise included infant formula, adult nutrition powders, health and beauty products, over the counter medication, and other goods.
- BPU worked with retailers and gathered intelligence about the suspects for an investigation and secured three search warrants.
- Multiple subjects associated with the business were arrested.
- BPU seized \$200,000 in stolen goods.
 - Anti-theft stickers used by Safeway and CVS provided valuable clues to the true impact to retailers suffered due to the criminal activity of Vien Dong Cargo.
 - > Overall, losses estimated to be in the millions of dollars.





Other Matters of Interest: Prostitution







Crime and Quality of Life Issues Associated with Prostitution

- Violent crime (e.g., homicides/shootings)
- Subjects threaten residents
- Subjects urinate and defecate in driveways
- Discarded condoms
- Revealing clothing
- Increased traffic in residential "Johns" circling





Prostitution Statistics May 2017 – October 2018

- Total number of persons arrested 880
 - ➤ Women 749
 - **>** Johns − 111
 - \triangleright Pimps 20
- Juveniles taken to the shelter 17
- Guns recovered 5





Statistics Analysis May 2017 – August 2018

- 486 persons arrested one time (not repeat offenders)
- 27 subjects arrested 3 or more times (103 arrests)
- County of residence for the arrestees
 - > Santa Clara County: 161 (111 Johns)
 - ➤ Alameda County: 149
 - > Sacramento County: 110
 - Contra Costa County: 76
 - > San Joaquin County: 70
 - > Out of state/Southern California: 49

Human Trafficking Task Force

- Dedicated to ending human trafficking in San Jose.
- Aggressively investigates all reports/tips received.
- Comprised of 1 Sergeant, 4 Detectives, 1 Sr. Office Specialist & 1 part-time Office Specialist.
- Responds after hours.
- Works with outside agencies (LEIHT, CSEC) and non-governmental agencies (SBCEHT, Polaris, NCMEC) to improve investigative abilities and victim needs.
- Improves education through courses and seminars held by agencies and NGOs around the nation.





Human Trafficking

- Human Trafficking section 236.1(c) PC is defined as: A person who causes, induces, persuades, or attempts to cause, induce, or persuade, a person who is a minor at the time of the commission of the offense to engage in a commercial sex act
- The majority of Human Trafficking victims recovered are juveniles contacted during street level prostitution enforcement
- As prostitution enforcement increases, prostitution activities and contact with human trafficking victims decreases








HTTF Means of Contact Jan-Sept 2017 vs Jan-Sept 2018








Victims by Age








Victims by County








Victims by Ethnicity Jan – Sept 2017 vs Jan – Sept 2018








Group Home vs Non-Group Home








Reported Missing vs Not reported Missing
