SUBJECT: RETROACTIVE APPROVAL OF THE OCTOBER 30 INTERFAITH COMMUNITY VIGIL AND GATHERING AS A CITY SPONSORED SPECIAL EVENT, TO EXPEND CITY FUNDS AND AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT DONATIONS OF MATERIALS AND SERVICES FOR THE **EVENT**

RECOMMENDATION

1. Retroactively approve the Interfaith Community Vigil and Gathering held on October 30, 2018 as a City Council sponsored event and approve the expenditure of funds.

2. Approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses or community groups to support the event.

3. Place the item on the November 27, 2018 Council Agenda for action.

BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

The series of hate filled events that occurred during the last week of October culminated with the largest hate crime perpetrated on the Jewish community in the history of the United States at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh, PA on October 27. Local community leaders from multiple denominations requested assistance with coordinating a response as a show of solidarity and compassion. A community gathering, free and open to the public, was held on Tuesday, October 30, 2018 at the Plaza area at San José City Hall with more than 500 people in attendance. This non-denominational community event was coordinated through the Jewish Federation of Silicon Valley in cooperation with the Mayor's Office, City departments, other agencies and other educational institutions, business organizations, and community volunteers.
