2. HR 5950; S2937 (Representative Roybal-Allard and Senator Smith) Humane Enforcement and Legal Protections for (HELP) Separated Children Act. (Carrasco).

Vice Mayor Magdalena Carrasco asked that a letter be sent to the Department of Justice, and requested the Intergovernmental Relations Office team in partnership with Immigrants Affairs to prepare an analysis of the situation and return to the Rules Committee for action.

Stacy Shih, (representing Assemblymember Ash Kalra) shared his sentiment that the White House has unveiled its policy of tearing apart children from their families, as well as conveyed intent to destroy America; therefore, solidarity with the families affected is required.

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2. HR 5950; S2937 (Representative Roybal-Allard and Senator Smith) ... (Cont'd).

Councilmember Davis reiterated the need to stand up for kids and alluded to the lifelong trauma associated with separating children from their birth parents.

<u>Public Comments</u>: Blair Beekman commented on the Enforcement and Legal Protections for (HELP) Separated Children Act.

<u>Action</u>: Upon motion by Vice Mayor Magdalena Carrasco, seconded by Councilmember Dev Davis, and carried unanimously, Bills HR5950 and S2937 were referred to staff for analysis, with a recommendation to be made to the Rules Committee when ready. A letter on the City's position opposing zero tolerance policies would be sent to Attorney General Jeff Sessions. (5-0.)
