Project Update

December 2018



Project Overview

- 2.4-mile light rail from Alum Rock Station to Eastridge Transit Center
- LRT in median of Capitol Expressway (side running at Tully Road)
- Elevated light rail guideway entire alignment
- Elevated station Story Road and at grade station at Eastridge Transit Center
- LRT uses median and requires removal of HOV lane between Story Road and Tully Road



Solutions that move you

Project Status

- Preliminary Engineering Complete
- In process of updating Environmental Impact Report
 - □ VTA reviewing public comments
 - □ Final report planned for early 2019
 - □ VTA Board certification planned for Spring 2019
- Utility relocation anticipated in early 2020 with light rail construction beginning in Fall 2020 (pending certification of EIR and budget approval)



Critical Community Issues

- VTA in coordination with City and County partners to evaluate project needs and communicate project information with the community, especially for the critical issues.
- Critical issues include (among others):
 - Traffic condition after construction
 - □ Traffic congestion during construction
 - Noise and vibration during construction
 - Property acquisition
- Access to light rail platforms

Next Steps

- Finalize Environmental Document and approve project changes
- Establish community working group and perform formal public outreach
- Confirm property needs and prepare for acquisition and utility relocation
- Understand and evaluate ways to minimize inconvenience during construction (traffic congestion, noise and vibration)
- Incorporate community involvement in aesthetics of identified elements
- Continue with Engineering of construction documents



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
