Dear Honorable Mayor and City Council:

On behalf of the San José Library and Early Education (SJLEE) Commission, I would like to thank you for your continued support of the San José Public Library System and the many essential services it provides to our community.

As the Commission that oversees the work of our libraries and early education in San José, we especially appreciate your support for the Library to better serve adult literacy students, implement the Career Online High School program, enhance access to international language materials and unique historic and cultural collections, provide developmentally appropriate materials and programs for young children and students through the Education & Digital Literacy Initiative and create the one-year Juvenile Fine-Free Materials pilot which you authorized last year.

The mission of the San José Public Library is to enhance lifelong learning for all members of the community. With this in mind, the SJLEE Commission respectfully asks the Council to support the following priorities in the upcoming 2019-2020 fiscal year:

- Annualize the Juvenile Fine-Free Materials program;
- Annualize the positions related to the Education & Digital Literacy Initiative; and
- Consider expanding service to 7-days a week, offering access on Sunday's at one branch in each Council District.

The Commission is grateful for the Mayor and City Council's action to fund the Juvenile Fine-Free Pilot program for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. We again want to emphasize the importance of decoupling Library fines and fees from revenue. The Library's youngest users may benefit the most from the many educational opportunities the Library provides. However, Library fines and the fear of accruing them often keep children and parents from using the Library, and schools from partnering with the Library to distribute Library cards. These assertions were born out during the pilot phase, as Library staff have reported that the number of juvenile and teen cardholders has increased 6.25% in the first six months of the pilot, and that the number of juvenile and teen card holders that are checking out material has increased 8.3% in the same time period. Additionally, the burgeoning partnerships between school districts and the Library to issue library cards to all students is significantly impactful not only to our students, but also to the school and educational networks that support our students. It is possible that in the near future we may be significantly closer to living in a City where a majority of the 250,000 residents under the age of 18 have a library card thanks to this program change and your leadership. The Commission believes that impact and benefit is well worth the forgone revenue from late fines.

The Commission is also thankful for the City Council's unanimous support and approval of the Education and Digital Literacy Initiative, which was approved last May. Shortly after the approval of the initiative, one-time funds were utilized to fund two staff members to implement the SJ Learns grant and expanded learning programming, as well as develop the SJ Promise/college and career readiness programming. With those positions coming to the end of their initial term, it's important that the City create and fund permanent positions that will allow for the continued development and implementation of those two programs without impacting Library operations. To further meet the needs of the initiative, Library staff has proposed adding a

small number of part time staff to allow for additional programming and an additional five open-hours at the King Library Children's Room, as well as programming at the Mt. Pleasant Bridge Branch Library.


The Commission respectfully requests that the City Council consider funding the expansion of Library hours to 7-day a week service at one branch in each Council District. Opening the Library to the public on Sunday fills a community need for greater access to Library programming and materials. In a survey, residents cited the opportunity to visit the Library on Sunday as the most favorable time to expand hours, ranking ahead of earlier or later operational hours during the work week. Matching the existing operational hours at King Library of 1:00pm – 5:00pm on Sunday at one branch per Council District would provide greater access to learning, educational materials and technology, and enhance the equity of services by location. Expanding services to 7-days a week is a worthwhile investment.

The Commission appreciates that budgeting is a values-based action, which takes considerable balancing and fiscal responsibility. Nevertheless, the priorities submitted above make a significant impact toward realizing a vision that advances education and self-sufficiency, and leverages a vibrant, culturally relevant community asset. Imagine a community where every child had a library card and could attend programs or do their homework with their family each and every day of the week, regardless of where they live or the barriers they and their families face on a daily basis.

We appreciate your consideration of the importance of our public libraries and the benefits they offer when prioritizing the City's budget for the coming fiscal year.

Thank you for your vision and leadership.
