**SUBJECT: RETROACTIVELY APPROVE TRASH TALK SPONSORED BY
COUNCIL DISTRICT 6 AS A CITY COUNCIL SPONSORED SPECIAL
EVENT TO EXPEND CITY FUNDS AND ACCEPT DONATIONS OF
MATERIALS AND SERVICES FOR THE EVENT**

RECOMMENDATION

1. Retroactively approve the Trash Talk scheduled on March 8, 2019 as a City Council sponsored Special Event and approve the expenditure of funds.
2. Retroactively approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses or community groups to support the event.

BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

Trash Talk was held on March 8, 2019 at 2325 Canoas Garden Avenue and sponsored by Councilmember Dev Davis. This special event was an opportunity for residents to chat with Councilmember Dev Davis and her team while helping clean-up the streets of District 6. The event is free and open to the public.

ANALYSIS

Approval by the City Council of the event will ensure compliance with the Council's prior direction regarding Council Special Events. In observance of existing fundraising disclosure requirements, Councilmember Dev Davis will report any cash or in-kind donations received for the event on their Disclosure of Fundraising Report (DFR-1). Approval of this memorandum will enable Council District 6, City departments and the Office of the City Clerk to proceed with

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the event. Any cash donations received will be processed pursuant to the City's normal financial and budgetary procedures.

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST

The Office of Devora Davis will post the event in a public newsletter to District 6 constituents online.
