SUBJECT: ACTIONS RELATED TO THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS GRANT AGREEMENT

## REASON FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL

To provide additional information regarding the selection of community based organizations selected to be included in the City's application for the State of California Board of State and Community Corrections Youth Reinvestment Grant Program.

## **ANALYSIS**

On February 25, 2019, the City invited agencies that had already been qualified through the Bringing Everyone's Strengths Together ("BEST") Grant Program to submit proposals through a condensed solicitation process. As is referenced in the original memo, dated March 4, 2019, this supplemental memo provides the results of the condensed RFP.

Eleven agencies submitted proposals. Staff evaluated the proposals, and the top ranked proposals are listed below (in ranked order). Staff selected the agencies listed below to be included in the grant application as potential partners, subject to the final award by the Board.

With the approval of this memorandum, the City will submit the grant application to the Board, including the list of community based organizations above as potential grant partners. Upon award from the State, staff will negotiate the exact scopes of service with agencies that will satisfy Youth Reinvestment Grant Program requirements. Staff anticipates that the majority of the award will be negotiated to be passed through to the top two to three ranked agencies, which are ConXión/New Hope for Youth Partnership, Fresh Lifelines for Youth, and Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County. While the list of agencies above are potential partners, the City has not guaranteed that funding will go to all partners, even if the grant is awarded.
