

San Jose Traffic Fatalities Up 37% in 10 years






National Traffic Fatality Perspective Cities 500k-1.5m







Regional Traffic Fatality Perspective San Jose has twice SF or Oakland's fatalities





2018 Traffic Fatalities: Key Findings





- Location: 87% (45) on major roadways (includes 4 on County Expwy).
- Pedestrians: 46% of fatalities compared to <2% of mode share.
- Older Pedestrians: 38% of pedestrian fatalities (9 of 24) are age 65+. The older adult population and percentage of the population (12.7% in 2017) is growing.
- Speeding: most common known factor contributing to fatalities and severe injuries.
- Motorcycle: 13% of fatalities, compared to <1.2% of mode share (none are scooters)
- Darkness: 56% of fatalities.




Vision Zero Core Principles

- 1. Traffic deaths are preventable and unacceptable.
- 2. Human life and safety takes priority over mobility.
- 3. Transportation system that accounts for human error.
- 4. Speed is a fundamental predictor of crash survival.
- 5. <u>Safe human behaviors</u>, education and enforcement are essential to a safe system.
- 6. Policy alignment at all levels of government.



Evaluation: Priority Safety Corridors


- 17 Priority Safety Corridors
 - 55% of 2018 fatalities
 - 38% of 2018 severe injuries
- Strong overlap with communities of concern
- \$29m in grant funds awarded on these corridors





Evaluation: Older Pedestrians

- Vision Zero Analytics
- Pedestrian safety program focused on older adults, age 65+









Enforcement
