Safe Parking Pilot Program Overview

Start Date	November 1, 2018
Location	Seven Trees Community Center
Target Population	Families
Capacity	17 cars and/or RVs each night
Eligibility	Referral only, vehicle must be operable
Services	Intensive case management, on-site security





November 1, 2018 – April 30, 2019

- 689 families contacted
- 44 families enrolled
 - 75 adults
 - 88 children
- 94% of families exited to shelter or housing









SUCCESSES

- Program flexibility
- Individualized case management
- Access to on-site services showers, teen center, private rooms, library, gym
- Collaboration with Police, Vehicle Abatement, Library, PRNS
- Onsite security in evening hours





CHALLENGES

- Vehicles parking in neighborhood, not affiliated with pilot program
- Neighborhood safety concerns
- Daytime enforcement of rules on a public lot;
 need for safe daytime parking
- Program recruitment and capacity
