### Overview of Small Business in San José

- 50,000+ Small Business in the City
- 35,250 Self-Employed (accounting, catering, house cleaning, etc.)
- 156,600 Individuals Employed (36% of all Jobs in San José)
- 60% of Small Business Owners are People of Color
- 51% are Immigrant Owned






