I. Recommendation

There is no doubt that there is a housing crisis in San Jose and that the crisis has disastrous implications for middle and low-income families. Unfortunately, our best efforts haven't hit the mark for the number of affordable houses necessary for the homeless and low-income families in San Jose. In order to close this gap, we the San José Youth Commission and the District 10 Youth Advisory Council recommend that:

- a. Naming rights for city-owned buildings, such as large affordable housing complexes and urban villages, be sold to the highest bidder.
- b. Private developers be given a percentage of the profits of the sale of their building's naming rights. And the sale to be facilitated by The City of San José, which would again sell to the highest bidder.

II. Background

San Jose has allocated millions of dollars' worth of funds to build affordable housing yet there is still a funding deficit that will result in a lack of affordable housing thereby displacing many families. Thus, it is necessary to raise additional funds for affordable-housing development in any manner possible. This issue is especially pertinent to the youth as youth homelessness is on the rise and supportive housing will give unaccompanied homeless youth a place to stay as well as help families with children to obtain a home.

III. Research

It is projected that an additional 4,385 units are needed in order to meet the City's 10,000 affordable-unit goal. At \$125,000 per unit, the City would need an additional \$548.1 million to develop these units. The decline in developments in San Jose means that additional fees on private developers would prove detrimental in the short and long-term as in-lieu fees and taxes won't be collected. As such, selling naming rights is a creative and cost-effective way to raise money for San Jose's Affordable Housing Fund. Historically, The City Council of the City of San José is the main group responsible for the naming of City-owned land and facilities. In some cases, though, donors and sponsors who contribute significant funds to the City and the project obtain the naming rights. The sale of naming rights has occurred in several instances in San Jose: for example, SAP paid the City 8.375 Million Dollars for the naming rights for the SAP center, formerly known as the HP Pavilion.

IV. Advantages

Expanding the City's naming rights policy is effectively a no-cost way to raise funds. Large affordable apartment complexes may attract companies that are interested in promoting their brand and are thus willing to pay for the naming rights to such projects. The city would be making a profit on every sale as the money they make wouldn't have been obtained if this policy recommendation was not passed.

V. Solvency

Considering the significant financing the City gives to affordable housing projects, selling the naming rights would be a method of gaining a return on the investment. Additionally, by helping private developers sell naming rights to their projects, more developers would be willing to build in San Jose as they are making more money. More housing projects means more taxes, in-lieu fees, etc. and the City gains funds from facilitating the sale of the naming rights as well. Thus, expanding the City's policy on the sale of naming rights will result in potentially millions of dollars of funding for affordable housing developments.

VI. Potential Setbacks

There is always the chance that companies may choose to not buy the naming rights for housing projects and apartment complexes.

VII. Closing Statement

While this policy may not generate the 500 million dollars needed to meet the target number of affordable housing units in San Jose, it will certainly help to alleviate some of the cost burdens and may result in the development of several homes for low-income families.

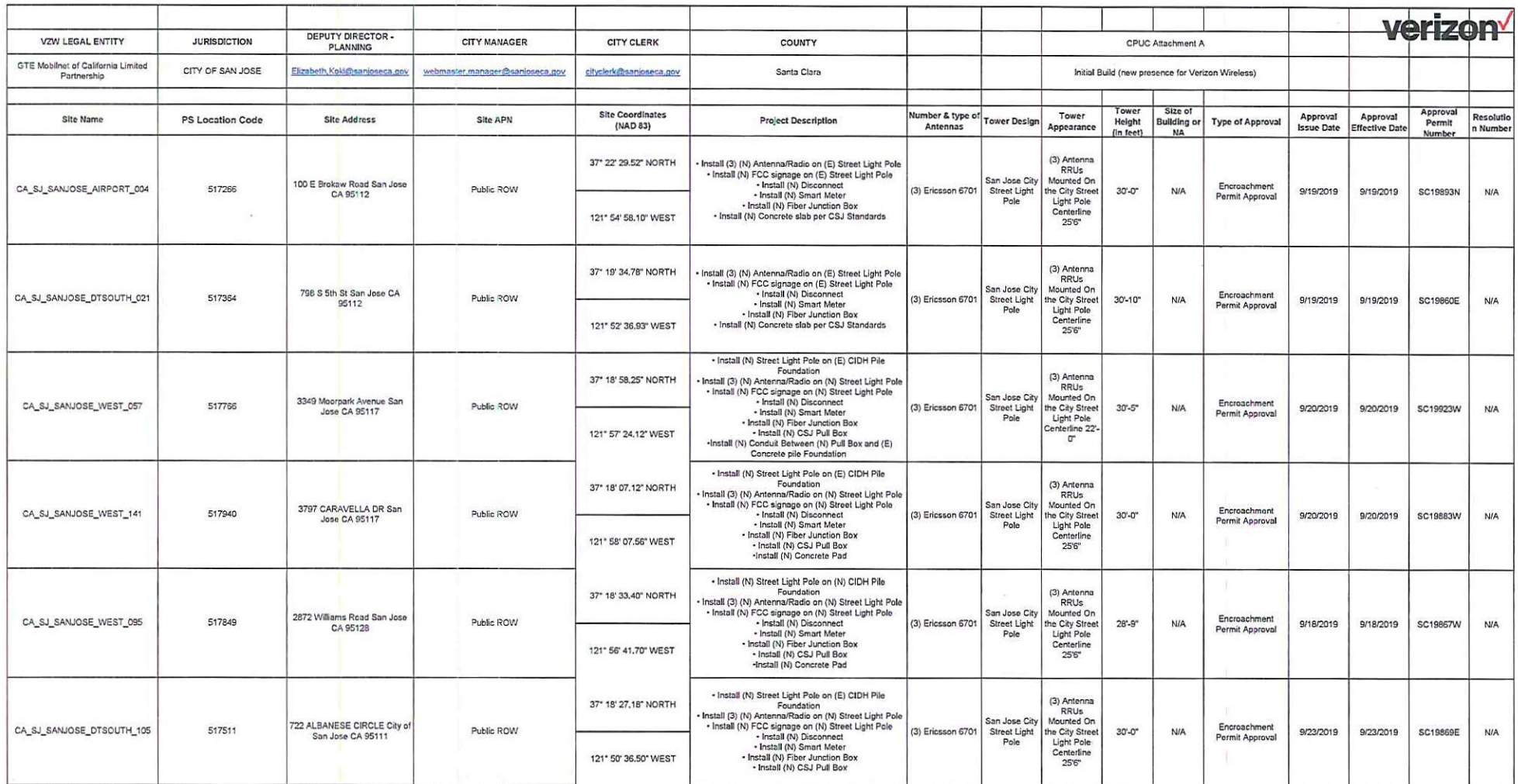

Subject: Displacement Study Session

One area that did not come up in yesterday's discussion of displacement and ways to resolve it was education and literacy.

Choosing to become a sanctuary city or state means taking on the burden of addressing the educational needs of those seeking sanctuary, to allow them to become self-sufficient. Failing to prepare these new arrivals for self-sufficiency will incur a much larger societal cost of housing those who are not self-sufficient, and their offspring, at public expense, indefinitely.

Our educational system is failing at the national, state and local levels, but California is in particularly bad shape.

The least literate city in the US, according to Time (2014), was in California: Bakersfield.

11 of the 26 worst performing large school districts in the entire U.S. are in California, and the state was sued in 2017 by the parents of children in an LA school where 96% of the entire school population failed to achieve grade level literacy per standardized testing.

And even in the "most literate" cities in the U.S., public schools are failing to teach literacy to unacceptably high numbers of their students.

This data claims that Santa Clara County has an illiteracy rate of 16.1%. However, this is likely be out of date, since the source data is from 2003, and literacy rates are trending steadily downward.

This issue is exacerbated by the fact that new immigrants typically have very different educational needs than most students, so a different curriculum is clearly required.

Dear Publishers, Editors, Newsanchors, and Journalists,

I would like to submit to your consideration news whose potential impact for your audience and the rest of the public warrants consideration: the exposure of unaccountable judges' riskless abuse of power.

Federal judges' abuse of power affect the whole of the population and does so more profoundly than the abuse of power by the President in the Ukrainian scandal: Judges wield their power over people's property, liberty, and all the rights and duties that frame their lives and determine their identity.

The particular reason why you should consider this news is its solid foundation: the judges' official statistics submitted annually to Congress under 28 U.S.C. §604 and their own statements on their official websites.

The specific abuse that would most intensely outrage the national media and the public is federal judges' self-interested and warrantless interception of people's emails and mail.

Judges do so to detect and suppress those critical of them so as to maintain their pretense of honesty and avoid any external exercise of constitutional checks and balances by the other two branches that would jeopardize their unaccountability as well as the unlawful benefits that they have already grabbed and intend to keep grabbing.

Therefore, I respectfully propose that you:

- a. review the video and the slides, and the article at [†]>OL2:951; and
- b. interview me to discuss:
 - 1) unaccountable judges' riskless abuse of power; and,
 - 2) a joint investigation of judges' interception of people's emails and mail. In this vein, consider the precedent for such investigation:

1. Information Technology (IT) experts found the U.S. Department of Justice engaged in hacking CBS computers

Former CBS Reporter Sharryl Attkisson(*>OL:215) noticed suspicious behaviors in her office and home computers. She and CBS hired three independent IT experts to examine them. They found digital dust that allowed them to conclude that the computers had been hacked by the Department of Justice, which wanted to eavesdrop on the two stories by Reporter Attkisson that were embarrassing it and the Obama administration:

DoJ's Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives' ill-conceived and disastrous Fast and Furious operation for selling guns and tracking their journey to Mexican druglords, led to the use of one such gun to kill an American border patrol. For his refusal to produce unredacted documents thereon, Congress held in contempt AG Eric Holder, who resigned.

The killing of the American ambassador and his aides at Benghazi, Libya, and the failure to heed the warning of an attack and protect the embassy were being investigated to determine the responsibility of Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and the State Department.

Rep. Attkisson is suing the Justice Department for \$35 million. This shows that doing what is right could lead to making money. Hence the proposed academic and business venture([†]>OL2:846).

2. Edward Snowden's leak and NSA's unlawful mass surveillance of the public

The findings of our investigation can ignite hotter national outrage than that sparked by the documents leaked by E. Snowden showing that NSA was collecting unlawfully, without warrants, metadata –e.g., phone numbers, callers' and callees' names, call dates and duration– of scores of millions of phone calls. The documents showed that; he did not have to prove anything.

Moreover, NSA did not prevent any calls, whereas the judges prevent the delivery of emails and mail based on their contents. That constitutes a clear violation of the American people's most cherished constitutional rights, namely, those under the First Amendment guaranteeing "freedom of speech, of the press, the right of the people peaceably to assemble [through the Internet and on social media too], and to petition the Government [of which judges are the third branch] for a redress of grievances"([†]>OL2:792¶1).
