Service contracts: Milpitas, Cupertino, Saratoga & Los Gatos




Field Services

22,877 calls for service FY 18-19

Approximately 100,000 phone calls into Dispatch

Most common call types: stray dogs and cats, dead animals, humane investigations, barking, nuisances, standards of care, dangerous dogs

Work with District Attorney – animal related cases of cruelty, and animal fighting





FY 18-19 Intake & care 18,589 animals


- 5,494 dogs

- 200 Winter months





Medical, Administration, Fundraising, Marketing & Volunteers

- 2 medical clinics public / internal
- Approximately 10,000 spay/neuter surgeries per year
- Licensing: process 65,000 licenses: \$1.6m/year
- 40% cost recovery: \$3.6m revenue, \$8m budget
- Gift Trust Guardian Angel program
