# Program Highlights

- City-sponsored Bills
  - AB 338 (Chu) Mobile home fire safety – **Signed into law**
  - AB 291 (Chu) Emergency Preparedness – **two-year bill**
  - AB 143 (Quirk-Silva) Emergency Shelters – **Signed into law**
  - AB 1745 (Kalra) Bridge Housing Community Extension – **Signed into law**
  - **New** - SB 378 (Wiener) Public Safety Power Shutoffs: Move in January



# Program Highlights

- State Budget Allocations for San José:
  - Estimated \$20 million in flexible funding for homelessness
  - \$5.5 million for equipment for Emergency Operations Center and new fire training center
  - \$750,000 for car break-ins
  - \$500,000 for Public Safety Power Shutoffs
- Statewide Funding for City Priorities:
  - \$5 million for Early Learning and After-School Library Program Grants
  - \$5 million for domestic and sexual violence prevention


