DEPARTMENT	POLICY POSITION
City Manager's Office / Environmental Services / Office of Emergency Management / Fire	Resiliency : Support efforts that make the city more resilient to climate change and natural disasters. Efforts include but are not limited to assessment of climate hazards and vulnerabilities, wildfire mitigation efforts such as infrastructure hardening, utility undergrounding, and vegetation management, and earthquake mitigation efforts on soft story seismic retrofits.
City Manager's Office/Finance	Funding: Protect and increase funding to deliver city services or build infrastructure for the benefit of the San José community.
City Manager's Office / Office of Emergency Management / San José Clean Energy / Public Works	Public Safety Power Shutoffs: Through legislation and regulation, advocate for adequate resources/equipment, and timely and appropriate information and notification that will allow the City to respond to and mitigate Public Safety Power Shutoff events. Explore potential legislation or regulations to require greater public oversight of Public Safety Power Shutoff events.
