#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Set a City Council Study Session entitled *Equity Framework: An approach to Achieving Better Outcomes for All* on Monday, February 10, 2020 from 1:30 – 4:30 p.m. in Council Chamber and approve a draft Study Session agenda.

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this two-part study session is to build a shared understanding of what equity means in the context of local government, why it is important, and how to embed a framework that reduces inequities. A shared understanding will allow us to lay the groundwork for a thoughtful, intentional, multi-year process of systems change that will improve outcomes for all.

#### **OUTCOME**

The City Council and Senior Staff have a shared understanding of, a) why equity is important, b) terminology and definitions, and c) the approach needed to move the City of San José toward being a more equitable city.

#### BACKGROUND

On December 13, 2019, the Administration organized a study session that focused on "why" equity work is important and "what" it entails. Stephen Pitti from Yale University, Leon Andrews from the National League of Cities, Julie Nelson from Race Forward, and shared the following elements:
