Analysis

PRNS agrees with the Youth Commission recommendation that City staff who work with youth (0-17) should receive training to properly "assist children who face mental health issues and/or crisis." This would also impact Library staff because they provide youth programming. PRNS has many programs that involve youth ages 0-17, however the department's definition of "youth" extends to age 24yrs when delivering youth/gang intervention/prevention programs programs. These older youth are often from traumatized backgrounds, and PRNS would recommend training any staff staff working with them as well. More research would be needed to determine what is the best/appropriate training across all youth programming, who would do the training, whether or not to develop/add staff that can deliver the training, classifications that must be trained, frequency of training, and cost.

Although the recommendation from the Youth Commission includes a reference that the City is legally obligated to provide "suicide prevention efforts" for grades K-12 (under recently signed AB1767), staff research has determined that this is the legal obligation of "...a county office of education, school district, state special school, or charter school." None of these institutions are within the City's purview, and since schools are mandated to provide these program, it is likely redundant for the City to do so also.
