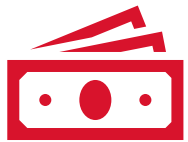

Early Education – Entering School Ready to Learn and Succeed

City programs for young children, 0-5 years of age, and Early Education Quality Standards, measurement and outcomes.



Expanded Learning – Grade Level Proficiency Beyond the School Day

These programs for young people serve many critical functions: bolstering skills needed for academic success, supporting workforce development, keeping our youth safe, and increasing civic engagement.



College and Career – Graduating Ready for Post-Academic Success

Helping every student to be able to choose a meaningful path upon graduating from high school, whether that path is developing valuable trade skills, attending college, or launching a small business.



Digital Literacy – Access, Affordability, Adoption

Programs that help San Jose fulfill its potential as the heart of Silicon Valley, including the Coding5K Challenge (coding classes) and the School2Home project (laptops for students).

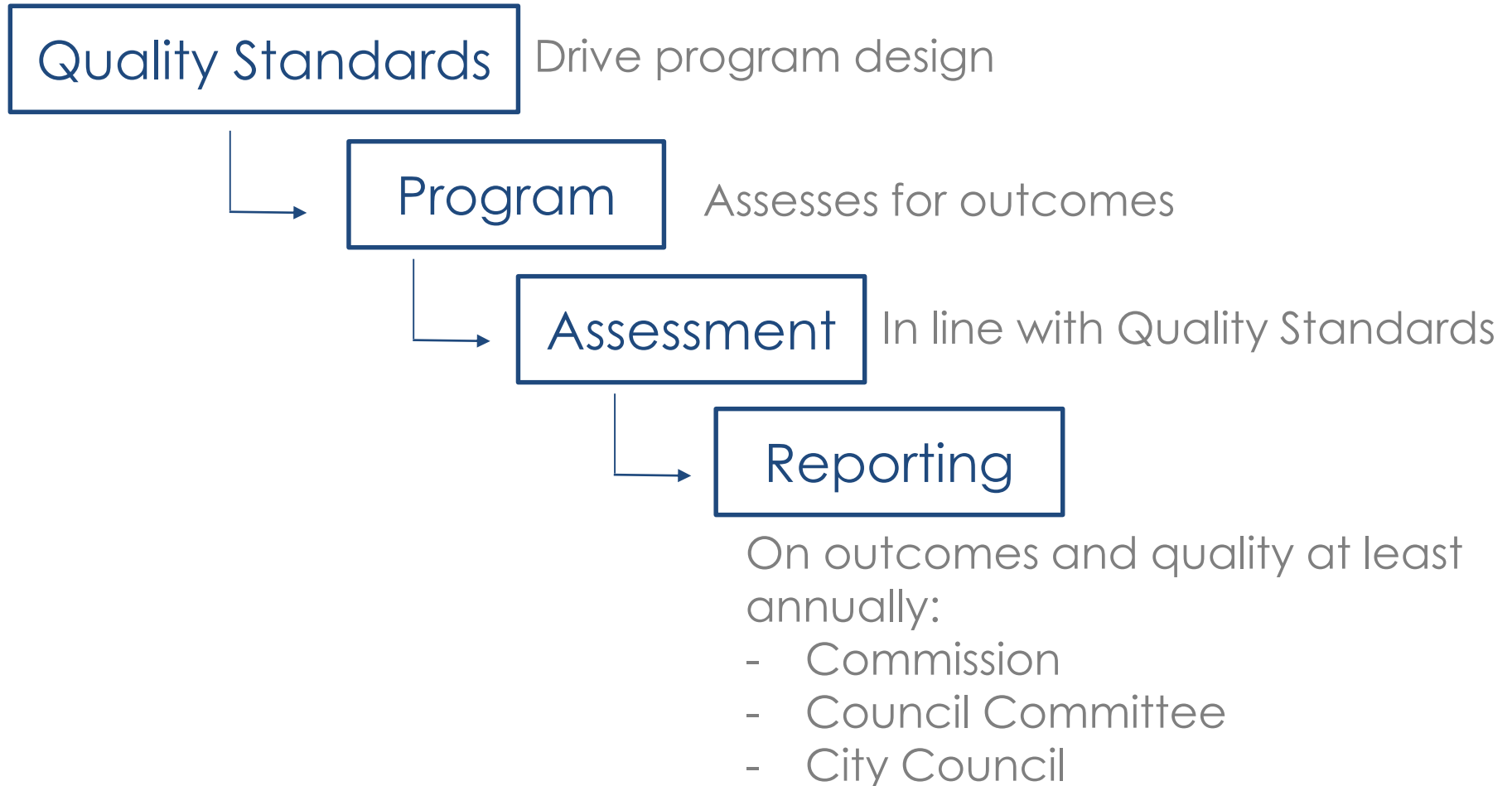
