- **♦**\$650 million one-time block grant
- ♠ Provides funds to:
 - Support regional coordination
 - Expand/develop capacity to address immediate homelessness challenges

- Outreach and Coordination
- Systems Support to Create Regional Partnerships
- Delivery of Permanent Housing

- ♠ New Navigation Centers/Emergency Shelters
- ♠ Innovative Solutions
- Prevention and Shelter Diversion
- and/or Infrastructure Development (up to 5%)
- ■ Youth Set-Aside (no less than 8%)
- ▲ Administrative (up to 7%)

Navigation Center Development	\$7,000,000	 Low barrier shelter targeting homeless individuals living in host neighborhood
Navigation Center Operations	\$6,000,000	 Service-rich shelter including day services 150 individuals Three years of funding (2022 – 2025)

Motel Voucher Program	\$2,000,000	 Service-rich temporary motel shelter 30 families each night One year of funding

Overnight Warming Locations	\$1,232,511	 Temporary shelter at City facilities Six months during the cold weather season 60 individuals each night One year of funding (Winter 2021)

Temporary and Incidental Shelter & Safe Parking	\$500,000	 Engage and support privately-owned operators under the City-wide ordinances Provide flexible funding for unmet needs 50 households each night One year of funding

Housing Problem Solving System	\$500,000	 Quickly resolve housing crisis through creative solutions and flexible funding 250 households One year of funding

Homelessness Prevention System	\$3,000,000	 Temporary financial assistance and supportive services 415 families One year of funding

Rental Subsidies & Supportive Services	\$2,000,000	 Rental subsidies and supportive services 40 homeless youth and families One year of funding






POTENTIAL HHAP IMPACT

 - ■\$14.2M
 - Youth & Families
 - ■\$7.5M
