Analysis

GREEN LIGHT: The Administration can implement this Nominated Idea under its current workplan. Item should be sent to Council to add to Department workplan. Explain how the Idea will be approached.

YELLOW LIGHT: The Administration recommends Council send this Nominated Idea to the Priority Setting Process due to [describe cost implications, workload impacts, or other factors].

The proposed idea is recommended to be Yellow Light since the current work is not part of the existing work plan for the Department. This proposal would apply to all zoning districts (excluding R-1 and R-2) impacting large portions of the City and therefore require significant community engagement. The project would require a full CEQA analysis. The Ordinance Team, which would work on this proposal, is currently engaged in several other City Council Priorities including: (4) Electronic Billboard, (11) Review of Cannabis Land Use and Regulatory Provisions, and (20) Downtown Zoning Code Update. The team is also engaged in other key projects including Zoning/General Plan land use designation alignment and Tiny Homes on Wheels ordinance amendment. Additional analysis would be required to study the feasibility of current industrial uses in industrial zones with the introduction of these new uses. This would also require a General Plan amendment to allow these uses in industrial areas.
