- 8.__ Actions related to a Moratorium on Evictions and Income Loss Due to COVID-19.
- 1. Approve an Ordinance that establishes a moratorium for non-payment of rent evictions for tenants with incomes affected by the novel coronavirus (COVID-19). Specifically, the ordinance would:
 - a. temporarily prohibit eviction of a residential tenant for non-payment of rent, if that tenant meets the criteria listed in the ordinance regarding COVID-19;
 - b. Provide that the moratorium will commence upon the council's adoption of a resolution declaring the commencement and making findings regarding in connection with COVID-19 and that such moratorium would expire thirty days unless extended.
- 2. Adopt an urgency ordinance that establishes a moratorium for non-payment of rent for tenants with incomes affected COVID 19 virus. Specifically, the ordinance would:
 - a. Invoke the urgency provisions in the City Charter, as an emergency measure for immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety, to temporarily prohibit eviction of a tenant for nonpayment of rent, if that tenant meets the criteria listed in the ordinance regarding COVID
 19:
 - b. Provide that the moratorium will commence upon the council's adoption of a resolution declaring the commencement and making findings regarding in connection with COVID-19 and that such moratorium would expire thirty days unless extended.

Please note: Approval of this urgency ordinance requires 8 or more affirmative votes (2/3)

3. Discuss and direct the City Attorney to return with an ordinance and urgency ordinance establishes a moratorium for non-payment of rent for small business tenants with incomes affected COVID 19 virus.

4. Discuss creating a funding pool and/or budget changes for San Jose residential tenants and small businesses for those impacted by COVID-19.
