

# The Three Challenges of Now

<p>Imperative 1 <b>Save Lives</b></p>	<p><b>Public Health</b></p>	<p>Slow and Reduce the Spread of Covid-19 and support our most at-risk people</p>
<p>Imperative 2 <b>Save Livelihoods</b></p>	<p><b>Economic</b></p>	<p>Support individuals, families and businesses so they make it through the shelter in place and safely return to work</p>
<p>Imperative 3 <b>Preserve our Fiscal Health</b></p>	<p><b>Fiscal</b></p>	<p>Ensure the continued fiscal health of the City so we can meet Imperative 1 and 2 while providing essential services.</p>

# Slow and reduce the spread of COVID-19, and support our most at-risk people

## Roadmap through the Epidemic: City Response – Highest Priority Actions

1. Compliance with Public Health Orders ("Shelter in Place")
  - + Education, enforcement and engagement
2. Essential Services (Continuity of City Operations)
  - + Ensuring essential services are provided safely for the duration of the epidemic
3. Support for At-Risk Communities/Populations
  - Food & Necessity Distribution and Feeding
    - Senior Support and Services
    - Medically At-Risk Support and Services
  - Homeless Support and Services
  - Housing for Quarantine and Isolation
  - Local Assistance for:
    - Individuals and Families
    - Small Business and Non-Profit Support
  - + County wide food distribution, focusing first on the most at-risk and then, scale and sustain
  - + Support seniors in isolation
  - + Support medically at-risk populations in isolation
  - + Increase hygiene services and health support to homeless population
  - + Identification and provision of housing for those in quarantine or isolation who cannot do so on their own
  - + Local assistance for individuals and families
  - + Support small businesses and develop understanding of new forms of assistance (e.g. SBA) and begin to operationalize
4. Powered by People – Support our people so they can act
  - Ensure Safety of City Staff Performing Essential Services
  - Families Support for City Staff Performing Essential Services (including childcare)
  - + Support safety of City Staff performing essential services
  - + Prioritize testing, child care, and other support services for staff performing essential services

## Enabling Actions Supporting the Response

- Silicon Valley Strong Campaign
  - Non-Profit & Private Sector Mobilization and Response
  - Volunteer Mobilization and Response (Food Distribution)
  - + A public campaign amplifying public health messages, raising funds, and volunteers.
- Communications with Community and Language Capacity
  - + Messaging to broader community with focus on most at-risk in multi languages.
- Reassignment of Staff in Non-Essential Services
  - + Temporarily re-assign staff in non-essential services to essential or emergency management functions.
- Scaling Remote Working Capacity for City Staff
  - + Rapidly building up our remote worker capacity and providing support services to those working from home.
- Understanding Future Trajectory of Epidemic and Response Options
  - + Modeling and understanding future trajectory of COVID-19.


