

Summary of Recommendations

- Ratify and authorize key agreements that will allow the City to feed, shelter, and provide necessities for our most vulnerable populations


Appropriation actions will support:

- 3 Food and Necessities Distribution


Additionally, creation of designated fund will enable the City to comply with procurement and documentation requirements in order to pursue maximum reimbursement.
