Homeless individuals

- Poor health and susceptible disease
- Disproportionate impact on communities of color
 - Latinos, Black/African American and American Indian/Native Alaskans in homeless community

CalOES Trailers

- March 19th & 20th City received 104 trailers
- Significant repairs required
- State mandates use:
 - 1) COVID positive
 - 2) persons under investigation or
 - 3) **high risk per CDC**



Operations Overview

- Supports compliance with shelter in place order
- No guests/visitors
- Daily health screenings, temperature checks & wellness checks
- Phased occupancy – 30 units per phase
- 24/7 private security & controlled entrance



Demobilization of Site

- Sufficient containment of pandemic & shelter placement
- Happy Hollow Park and Zoo is ready to open
