Good morning council members and Mayor. Today I am respectfully asking you to please not support the extension of a curfew for another 60 days. This curfew not only targets limiting the freedom of expression for those protesting the deaths of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor at the hands of the police. This curfews empower police to make arrests that would be unwarranted otherwise, and gives them another way to justify responding to peaceful protests with state. Federal courts have also recognized that curfew-imposed restrictions are a violation of the First Amendment rights. Curfews violate fair and equal treatment under the law as well as substantive and procedural due process, making them unconstitutional in other ways as well.
